MVAS Offers Bird Camp Scholarship to a Youth from Groundworks Doña Ana

For the first time, MVAS will provide a scholarship to a teen or young adult from Doña Ana County to attend a week-long bird camp.

To enhance our education program, the MVAS Board voted to provide tuition and travel to a pool of candidates associated with Groundworks Doña Ana. In the summer of 2014, Groundworks Doña Ana launched an innovative program for teens and young adults to serve the community. These16- to 24 year-olds worked full-time in partnership with the Las Cruces District Bureau of Land Management building trails, cleaning trash off the public lands and, most importantly, developing conservation interpretation programs for the BLM's recreation sites.

On any given weekend, one of the Groundworks team gave hikes, patio talks or lectures at Dripping Springs or Aguirre Springs.

MVAS will provide one of these terrific students the opportunity to learn more about birds at an Audubon or similar type of bird camp. In return, the student will be required to present an educational program to a local group of middle school students.

MVAS 2015 Scholarship Awarded

MVAS Scholarship Committee has chosen Matt Gould, a PhD student in the Fish, Wildlife and Conservation Ecology department at NMSU, for our 2015 Scholarship.

He is monitoring black bear populations in the American Southwest and northern Mexico with a focus on genetic variation and populations that may exhibit genetic isolation due to habitat loss and other human related activities. Gould will present his findings at the MVAS potluck in 2016.

The MVAS Richard Bischoff Memorial Scholarship was established in 2007, and the first grant awarded in 2008. This year it drew five proposals.

The scholarship supports graduate student research at New Mexico State University that is consistent with the MVAS mission and promotes natural resource conservation.
